

Founded in 1996, Korora is in its twenty-ninth season in 2024–2025. The flagship ensemble of Korora Choirs, Korora has received first and second place on Canadian national festival stages. The choir also placed first in their division in the CBC/Choral Canada Competition for Amateur Canadian Choirs in 2015. Korora has received several awards for its work with youth, music education, and its African Projects Fund. While Korora takes pride in these accomplishments, the choir focuses on creating a learning experience for young singers while providing audiences with exciting and innovative musical performances.

Korora has been a featured ensemble at many events both nationally and internationally, including the Rocky Mountain National Music Festival, Podium (the biennial conference of Choral Canada), the Canadian Music Educators National Conference, the regional conference of the American Choral Directors Association (ACDA), ISME conference, and others. In addition to performances in many North American cities, the choir has toured Norway, Denmark, Sweden, Germany, Italy, Switzerland, Malaysia, Namibia, South Africa, Botswana, Eswatini, and Zambia. Korora was a featured ensemble at the IFCM World Choral Expo in Lisbon, Portugal in July 2019 and the Harbour Voices Festival in St. John's in July 2024.

In 2025, Korora will travel to southern Alberta January 31 – February 2, and to Victoria, BC to perform in the Kaleid Festival from May 1-4. Korora will share the stage with the Edmonton Symphony Orchestra twelve times this season.

Shumayela, a choir for treble and changing voices, continues to expand its horizons, develop its membership and satisfy a variety of musical tastes. The choir has toured throughout British Columbia and Alberta, performed in Ottawa at the Unisong festival for Canada Day, and in May 2016 the group was featured at the prestigious biennial choral conference for Canada, Podium.

Recent highlights include a tour to New York City to sing at Carnegie Hall in the spring of 2019, and then a performance as special guests of the Alberta Children's Choir in 2022. Wherever the choir travels, they spread the joy of music-making and hope to bring communities together through song.

ChandraTala, under the direction of Laura Hawley, was founded in September 2019. An upper voices choir for experienced soprano and alto singers of any gender identity, the choir's Sanskrit name translates "rhythm of the moon."

The choir has performed with the Canadian Chamber Choir, Edmonton Symphony Orchestra, Ariose Women's Choir, had collaborated with local Edmonton musicians including singer-songwriter Maddie Storvold, and has premiered several new Canadian works. During the period from March 2020 to June 2021, during the COVID-19 pandemic isolation period, Chandra Tala participated in the Sonic Timelapse project, commissioned two new works by Canadian female composers, and pursued a rich season of workshops with composers and clinicians, small group and virtual choir projects, including a cross-Canada virtual choir collaboration with six of Canada's top uppervoices/women's ensembles. The choir performs in the SkirtsAfire festival and recently participated in a consortium to commission Ukrainian composer Iryna Aleksiychuk, Chandra Tala continues to perform and collaborate throughout the community, pursue diverse repertoire, commission new works, work with clinicians locally and nationally, and support one another in community and song.
